Worship and Service



Service Projects - strengthening a Christian witness in our region through practical service to others — at the Institute itself, at a local church or in the local community.

French Worship - Daily French worship gives students the experience of communicating with God in a new language and cultural context.

Institute staff provide short but informative sessions that expand students’ practical knowledge of history, increase students’ effectiveness for interacting with others in French culture, and give practical experience for communicating in the French language.

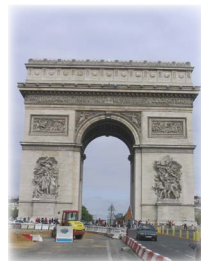

Paris - Where it all began

And in **NORMANDY**
some of the sights you will explore and experience include . . .



Mont St. Michel - Marking the epic battle in the heavens between Michael the Archangel and Lucifer.

Caen - Here we jump back into the Middle Ages to visit the castle of William the Conqueror – who in 1066 was truly one of history’s “mighty men” (Rev. 6:15).

The Bayeux Tapestry - 233 ft. long, this 1000 year old “You-Tube video” depicts Duke William’s conquest of England in graphic detail.

D-Day Beaches - Re-live the day that changed the world. Explore the bunkers and bomb craters of Pointe du Hoc, gaze on Omaha Beach, stroll through the American Cemetery . . . and remember . . .

Normal French life

In Franceville. The Jacques Lefevre Institute owns its own center in Franceville — a small town on the Normandy coast just 2½ hours from Paris and 20 minutes from Caen. Cafés, shops, crêperies, bakery, butcher and grocer provide many opportunities to connect with French culture.



The Institute

The Program Fee includes:

- Round-trip airfare to Paris from *your nearest airports*
- Round-trip ground transportation from Paris to the Institute Ministry Center in Normandy
- All lodging and all meals in both Normandy and Paris
- All mission service project transportation and expenses
- Language, culture, and history instruction, along with guided-visit instruction on all excursions
- All excursion transportation and entry fees in both Normandy and Paris
- Travel insurance
- Subsidized laundry with a moderate additional charge per load
- Free WIFI (subject to program limitations)

The Program Fee does not include:

- Souvenirs, some public restrooms, church offerings
- Other miscellaneous personal expenses and optional free-time activities

Depart: **Thursday**, *Day Month Year* Return: **Sunday**, *10 days later*

To reserve, deposit payment (\$1000) and passport photocopy must be postmarked to the Institute by Friday, *Month Day*.

Final payment must be postmarked by *Month Day*.

Cancellation Refunds

- with written request postmarked . . .

Through Month Day: Full refund less (Direct Costs + \$100)

Month Day - Month Day: Full refund less (Direct Costs + \$500)

After Month Day: Full refund less (Direct Costs + \$1000)

Direct Costs are expenses already incurred by the Intitute on behalf of the student. However, the Institute makes every effort to recover as much as possible in refunds for Direct Costs which are then passed back to the student. An additional refund of up to \$300 is also added to the amounts above for cancellation due to the unfortunate circumstances of a medical difficulty (Doctor's note) or death in the student's immediate family.
