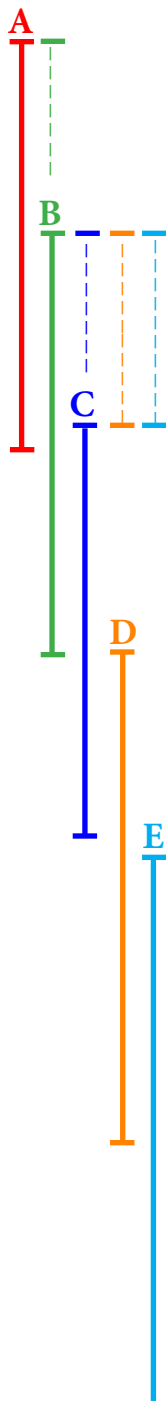

**French Grammar and Culture** — 3 credit hrs. (*Séjour includes this class only*)

Typically a student's 3rd semester of college-level French, this course provides intensive work in all four language skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing. Study includes both review and expansion of grammar and phonetics foundational to oral and written communication, along with substantial experience interacting with French culture and target-language materials.

**French Grammar and Conversation** — 3 credit hrs.

Typically a student's 4th semester of college-level French, this course continues to strengthen grammar comprehension while providing intensive work in all four language skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing. Study also includes basic phonetics. Extensive language use is applied in substantial interactions with French nationals, culture and target-language materials.

**French Conversation and Phonetics** — 3 credit hrs. (*Typically 300 level*)

This course provides intensive practice and instruction in French conversation, listening comprehension, and phonetics, with an additional focus on expanded vocabulary. Study includes continuing work in grammar, discourse, and critical thinking skills, and an orientation to informal and formal use of French. Taught in French by national professors at the Université de Caen.

**Exploring French Cinema** — 3 credit hrs. (*Typically 300 level*)

Using advanced conversation structures, this course uses cinema as a window on French history and culture. Students will use higher-level communication skills to engage abstract thoughts and concepts. Includes a focus on pronunciation and accent. Taught in French by national professors at the Université de Caen.

**French Spiritual Life Today** — 3 credit hrs.

(*Typically 300-400 level*)

This course provides students with an overview of spiritual belief and practice in today's France. A special focus on Christianity explores current Catholic and Protestant expressions of faith, along with the significant recent developments in evangelicalism. Students will gain a greater facility for understanding the spiritual perceptions of French people. Taught in French.

**Contemporary French Society and Culture**

— 3 credit hrs. (*Typically 300-400 level*)

This course concentrates on French life since WWII. Particular attention is given to social, political and economic structures, along with trends in art, media and daily living. Taught in French.

(*Chez Vous reserves the option of changing arrival and/or departure dates a couple of days in either direction due to unforeseen or changing circumstances.*)

**Which Study-Track is for me?**

Each Study-Track is a complete program and can accommodate small differences in language ability among the students - your French professor can help you decide which track is best for you. This table gives a good idea of the college-level French credits a student would have already obtained prior to each Study-Track . . .
